
Year 10 English – message from Ms Mouland, KS4 Curriculum Lead for English

- GCSE Literature and Language content will be covered from the start of Year 10.
- Students will be assessed on both Language and Literature content in their Year 10 assessments.

Letters were sent home last term with details about which texts to purchase for your child.

- This term we will be studying *Macbeth* and *The Empress* in English. Students should all have their own copies of these texts to support their learning and revision in Year 11.
- 1 hour of English homework will be set every week on **Firefly** by their class teacher.
- We recommend students have a few different coloured pens and highlighters to support with their annotations of the Literature texts and poems.





Year 10 Maths – Mr Powell, Director of Maths.

Students require:

- scientific calculator (preferably a Casio fx-83 GT-X calculator and we offer them on Arbor if they want),
- protractor,
- compass,
- and a positive attitude.

Equipment

- Red and black pens, pencils, ruler, rubber and scientific calculator (classwiz- purchased through Arbor is the cheapest option). As you progress through the GCSE curriculum calculators are used more frequently. 2 of your 3 GCSE papers are calculator papers.
- Protractor and Compass will be required for certain lessons and ALL exams.


Sparx Homework

- 100% completion, not accuracy. You can get things wrong and try again
- You have 7 days to complete
- Seek support from your teacher if you become stuck to help you with the questions
- "I didn't get it complete because I was stuck on a few questions" will not suffice. You must seek help if you need it, you must allow time to seek help. It is YOUR learning. OWN IT.
- The only way you will not achieve 100% in your homework is if you leave it until the night before, or you get stuck and do not ask for support.





Sparx Book – Example of what homework should look like.












Sparx Independent Learning:

• You can revise topics without having your teacher assign it to you as homework. You can be independent. You can practice what you find challenging, you can revise for assessments, you can practice more of the skills you learnt in class that you found tough. You can practice older skills you haven't practiced in some time- just to make sure you are still successful.

Year 10 Maths – message from Mr Powell, Director of Maths.

- Bring a positive attitude- GCSE curriculum topics and content are increasingly challenging.
- You may not understand a topic within one lesson, that's okay. More complex topics may take you 2, 3 or even 4 lessons to grasp and be successful. You need to be resilient. DON'T GIVE UP
- Teachers are there to support you. You must be proactive.
- Use the independent learning, target and optional homework to go above and beyond. Spending a little more time each week is an investment in YOUR education, YOUR outcomes, YOUR grades and YOUR future.



Year 10 Science

Head of Science is Mr McKee

- Your course is AQA combined science, also known as Trilogy Science.
- There are 'tiers of entry', a higher tier where you can achieve grades 4 to 9, and foundation aiming for grades up to 5.
- A change at GCSE, compared to KS3 is the "required practicals" which are science experiments that you need to learn about in detail.
- Every final paper will have some questions on the required practical
- How the experiment is set up, how to make it work well and what it tells us.This is different to years 7 to 9 where you didn't have to learn how an experiment works or be tested on it.

Year 10 Science

- We use **Kayscience** for KS4 (10 & 11) homework and revision. Pupils watch short videos and answer questions. We can track their scores and the completion of the videos and questions.
- A <u>calculator is essential for all science lessons</u>, we often process data and it is useful for checking patterns and analysing results. They are needed for calculations in lessons and for exams and mocks, not just in Physics and Chemistry units but Biology too.
- What is really important is <u>asking if your stuck</u>. A lot of science learning builds on other ideas, so it is important to check the basic facts if you're not sure and when we link ideas together, if in doubt ask.


Kayscience – Homework.

- Class Teachers will guide pupils through set up and logging in and there will be online help videos too.
- Pupils are asked online questions (there are also sometimes information slides to read too) and then they type answers.
- Questions can be repeated, in order to score a minimum 75%.
- We prefer pupils to repeat it, rewatch the video, and score higher, ideally 100% to get the most from the questions.

Kayscience – Homework.

The kayscience platform works on laptops, phones and tablets using a browser like edge or chrome, but it also has an app which works well on phones. A reason to be happy they are on their phone.


Kayscience – Looks like this.



Other Useful Resources. "Free Science Lessons"

Useful, very short, free, simple video resource. "Freesciencelessons" all one word or look on youtube. Doesn't explain as well as Kayscience and doesn't check for understanding – but straight forward facts and


definitions.



Other Useful Resources. Revision Guides will also be available soon.

Useful, but not essential. They don't suit all pupils though they are a good place to go for information, and easy to use and 'not online', so can avoid issues with sharing a laptop, or wifi.

Their weakness is they don't check for understanding if you only read the page and don't test yourself somehow.



Year 10 Geography (AQA) – Message from Miss Montanheiro

Welcome to Year 10 Geography. We are really looking forward to bringing you on our geographical journey

Core expectation:

- Your teachers expect lots of positivity and interaction in all geography lessons.
- Please come with the correct equipment plus two highlighters.
- All students will be given 1 hour of homework a week. These will tend to be focussed on content recall.
- Your teachers are always at hand to help you with any problems in class or problems with homework. You can speak to them in school or send an email
- You will be **tested in class at the end of every topic** (roughly every 4 weeks) and will always be given a weeks' notice about the test. The HW that week will be SENCA revision in preparation for the test.
- The scores you get in your test will give your teacher lots of information about how well you understood the topic/ how hard you revised for it etc. Please treat these tests seriously as the more you practice revision/recall/ testing the more successful you will be.
- Topics Tectonic Hazards, Weather Hazards, Climate Change, Ecosystems.
